Extending your visa and police registration

If you need to extend your visa whilst you are at University please read our advice at: http://as.exeter.ac.uk/support/international/immigration/visaextensions/

You MUST attend a Visa Workshop. The form is long and complicated and we don't want you to get it wrong! You can then make a one-to one appointment with Amelia or Sue. We will not be able to see you for an appointment if you have not attended the workshop. The office processes applications through the Student Batch scheme in conjunction with the Home Office in Durham. The Home Office has advised us that, due to the high volume of work and training that is currently going on, they will not be able to guarantee return of passports before Christmas and that students should not book travel until the return of their passports. The cost is £357 for a postal application.

Registering with the Police

If you are in the process of renewing your visa as a student you may be required to register with the police. Look in your passport at your new visa when it Is returned to you – it will say if you need to register. If you are required to register you should go to the Police station on Heavitree Road. They are open Monday to Friday 8.30-18.00. You will need to take your passport, 2 passport sized photographs and £34 cash exactly to cover the administration fee.

DANGERS

of breaching work conditions

In 2007 the removal of 5 students from the UK was narrowly averted. These students had been working in excess of the 20 hours per week and were therefore in breach of their immigration conditions. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU DO NOT WORK MORE THAN THE 20 HOURS PERMITTED TO YOU AS A STUDENT DURING TERM TIME, EVEN IF IT IS JUST AN HOUR OR SO MORE. OR BECAUSE YOU THINK 'EVERYONE DOES IT'.

Anyone found to be in breach of their immigration conditions can be subject to 'administrative removal'.

This means that there is no opportunity to appeal against the decision and you could be on a flight home within one day of being notified. BE WISE – DON'T DO IT



Student Ambassador Recruitment


Student ambassadors are being recruited from across all three campuses to join the Exeter Student








Opening Event




INTRODUCTION TO
